- 1. Pilot Project Leisure Pines Project
 - a. Partnership between County, Cal OES, CAL FIRE, and PG&E
 - Fell, removed and chipped trees and woody debris affecting approximately 120 homes along Highway 108
 - c. First tree mortality project in California (since Governor proclaimed a State of Emergency in October 2015).
 - d. CAL FIRE slash clean-up is 50% complete.
 - e. 100+ loads of logs were removed and delivered to wood sort yard, (adjacent to Ultrapower Chinese Camp), and converted to biomass or sold to wood shavings plant.
 - f. Excellent press coverage (KCRA, CAL FIRE, Cal OES, CSAC).
 - g. Everyone involved was very pleased with the outcome.
- 2. Future Projects
 - a. Old Highway 120 (mailed approx. 50 Right of Entry Forms).
 - b. Mi-Wuk Village (Mailed Approx. 940 Right of Entry Forms
 - i. Continue to work collaboratively with PG&E as they finalize their work plans with their new contractor.
 - c. Funding
 - i. Hazard Mitigation Grant (applied for \$4 million)
 - 1. Will announce grant awards in September
 - Grant application was for fuels reduction and vegetation management –private lands (within 100 ft of home defensible space)
 - 3. Asking homeowners to pay 25% share of cost
 - 4. Seeking 25% match for those homeowners who are unable to pay the 25% (subject to financial review and eligibility)
 - ii. CAL FIRE \$200K grants
 - 1. SRA
 - 2. Tree Mortality
 - a. Apply to use as match for Hazard Mitigation for those homeowners who cannot afford the 25% match

- b. Trucking costs for homeowners who have already paid to have trees cut but could not afford to have it hauled away
- Abate hazard trees on Community Service Roads.
 Currently no funding available to assist with this critical infrastructure.

iii. U.S. Forest Service

- 1. \$2 million road agreement with Stanislaus National Forest to abate hazard trees on U.S.F.S. land adjacent to County roads.
- iv. Regional CCC (\$23 hr-includes supervision, training & equip)
 - 1. Hires local youth (investing in local youth 18-24)
 - 2. Est. \$111k 4 months (6 person crew)
 - 3. Not called out for fires
 - 4. No campsite needed, as youth live locally
 - 5. Seeking funding to cost share with CDAA (ex. \$111k 4 mos. \$55K grant from CAL FIRE, \$55k CDAA (\$13,750 County Share of Cost)
 - 6. May need more than one crew (\$222 4 mos/\$111 CAL FIRE grant, \$111K CDAA/ \$27,750 County Share of Cost
- v. State CCC (\$500K 6 months)
 - 1. Hires youth from various locations (18-24 or up to 29 Veteran)
 - 2. \$500K 6 mos. (15 person crew)
 - 3. Need to provide camp location
 - 4. Can be called away for fires
 - Seeking funding to cost share with CDAA (ex. \$500K 6 mos. \$250K CAL FIRE grant, \$250K CDAA (\$62,500 County Share of Cost)
 - 6. Needs going forward
- d. Ultrapower Chinese Camp-NEED CONTRACT EXTENSION!
 - i. Critical infrastructure needed to deal with wood product
 - ii. If contract is not extended/renewed, we will have to find alternatives to reusing or recycling of wood products
 - iii. It is a bit redundant to be planning another bio-mass plant (NDRC) when we are in the midst of closing the current site
