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Are You Ready For the 2016 NAR Code of Ethics Training Cycle Deadline?

REALTORS® have been required to complete ethics training of not less than 2 hours, 30 minutes of instructional time within a four-year cycles. The current four-year cycle started January 1, 2013 and will end on December 31, 2016.


The training must meet specific learning objectives and criteria established by the National Association of REALTORS®. Failure to complete training during any cycle will lead to suspension of membership beginning in January and February immediately following the cycle deadline, and complete termination of membership starting March 1st after the cycle deadline.

Members may complete training through your local Association or through home study, correspondence, classroom or online courses. As part of the 12 FREE Hours of Online CE Courses from C.A.R., members can complete both the NAR requirement as well as fulfill their CE Requirement. Go to <u>store.car.org/12FreeCE</u> to access the training.

After this year, the Code of Ethics Training Cycle is every 2 years and training must be completed at any time during the established future cycles:

- January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2018
- January 1, 2019 to December 31, 2020

Not sure if you have completed your required NAR COE training for this cycle? Contact TCAR office for assistance right away! Please do NOT wait until the last minute, you could lose your Realtor membership and status!

PACE Update: At HPC meeting on Oct 12th. Hero and Ygrene were <u>again</u> on the agenda and argued for approval of PACE program in Tuolumne County (unfortunately Calaveras County recently approved on a 3-2 vote at the Board of Supervisors). Scott Dick, Government Affairs Director, Monterey County Association of REALTORS® attended and provided a well done Power Point presentation against approval. Supervisor Randy Hanvelt noted he is worried about County costs and responsibility and delayed any decision for a separate committee to review. I have asked Supervisor Hanvelt to place me on the committee.

Gov. Jerry Brown has signed AB 2693 (Dababneh), a C.A.R.-sponsored bill that requires Truth in Lending Integrated Disclosure – or TRID-like disclosures be provided to a property owner participating in a PACE program, a three-day right of rescission, and a notice that the property owner may not be able to refinance or sell without paying off the PACE "loan." This measure is important for areas that have already approved PACE energy Loans however, C.A.R. is not advocating for more area to adopt PACE programs now that this legislation is in place. Lyn Wilson, VP & Area Manager for Eastern Sierra Division has sent an email to Randy Hanvelt stating that Oak Valley Community Bank would not be in support of Hero or Ygrene programs. Oak Valley Bank does not make loans for homes when they can't be in first position and there are many other programs available through USDA or other agencies that are more beneficial. Please let our supervisors know that TCAR does not support PACE Energy loans.

Measure K: The Tuolumne County Board of Supervisors voted to place Measure K on the November 8, 2016 ballot. Measure K allows for affordable rental units to be built in our County utilizing public funding from state and federal housing programs to offset some of the development costs. The purpose of this measure is to plan for future affordable housing and save the cost of frequent elections. Any proposed project of rental housing would still go through every phase of the County's rigorous development approval process. There is no impact to the County taxpayers or the General Fund.

Measure K allows voters to acknowledge the need for affordable rental housing and it puts the County in a much more competitive position when seeking public funds. Rents are rising because there is a shortage of rental housing in our County. In Tuolumne County, almost two thirds of renters have trouble meeting their monthly housing costs.

<u>Craig Pedro Discussion Related to Fire Insurance:</u> As many of us know, there is a real problem with homeowner fire Insurance being dropped, not renewed, the costs being increased exponentially and Insurance Companies just pulling out of the area. County CAO Craig Pedro has met and corresponded with California Insurance Commissioner to try and get better understanding in our area and some help with the situation. Craig has provided a lengthily handout with correspondence, info on the California FAIR Plan, Maps showing Counties with many homes facing high fire risk (for some unexplained reason Tuolumne County is the worst) and other documentation showing that our County has had very little structure loss and does not warrant the current lack of availability and/or high cost. Bark Beetles & Tree Mortality: TuCare's recent tour dealing with Bark Beetle issues was very good and informative. Key issues are that the beetle infestation is naturally occurring but exacerbated by poor forest management and drought, it is not going away any time soon and there is no stopping on a global scale in our foothill community. There is hope for better forest management and the 350 acre test plots near Dodge Ridge that has proven how it can be accomplished.

Elections: Pat "Ziggy" Zicarelli recently stated that more than 36,000 REALTOR® members in our state are not registered to vote? This year is an election year, with the upcoming presidential election on Tuesday, Nov. 8. Getting involved is key to protecting the issues important to our industry. When REALTORS® are engaged in the electoral process, elected officials listen to our concerns. Please vote in the November 8th election. Key issues from my experience on the TUD campaign trail are long term viability of system and water availability /water rights, rates, Ag allocation of Raw Water costs and how ditches should be treated.
